SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. Preliminary Examination (Objective Type)
- 2. Written Main Examination (Subjective Type)
- 3. Viva-Voce (personal Interview)

Exam Pattern: The Exam Pattern will be as follows:

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- A candidate needs to be a citizen of India.
- A candidate needs to have the domicile of Haryana to get the reservation benefits.
- Applicants must have completed an LLB from any recognized institute.
- The age of the applicants must be between 21 years and 42 years.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

- The prelims exam shall be of objective type with multiple-choice questions.
- The question paper of the preliminary examination consists of 125 questions, each with four marks.
- The marking scheme of the Prelim's exam is that each question carries four marks, and for each wrong answer, you get a -0.8 mark.
- The syllabus includes questions about current events, Indian legal history, constitutional evolution, and statutes outlined in Civil Law.

MAINS EXAMINATION

- The Mains exam will consist of written papers with descriptive or narrative / essay-type questions.
- Each of the Mains written exams is of 3 hours duration.
 As per the Haryana Judiciary Exam Pattern, the Mains Haryana Judiciary Syllabus 2023 comprises five subjects:

- Hindi (in Devnagri Script) language paper shall comprise the following:-

VIVA VOCE (INTERVIEW):

- For a candidate to be qualified for viva voce, they must secure a minimum of 50% aggregate marks in all the written examinations in Mains.
- However, for the candidate belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, Backward Classes, Physically Handicapped, and Ex-Serviceman (ESM) candidates only (but not dependents of ESM), a minimum of 45% aggregate marks should be obtained for qualification.
- The interview will be conducted only in English.
- The interview is conducted to judge the personal qualities of the candidate.
- The interview will relate to matters of general interest and will test the candidate's alertness, intelligence, and general outlook.
- It is mandatory to appear for viva voce/interview to be considered for the final selection.
