- ❖ Each question carries one mark and there will be 0.25 negative marking

The Preliminary Examination will be a screening test of qualifying nature and will consist of one paper of multiple choice questions carrying maximum of 200 marks. In the preliminary examination questions on general legal knowledge and aptitude of the candidate, candidate's power of expression, flair in English, Knowledge of objective type legal problems.
